

RESOLUTION 2019 – 348

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPOINTING MUNICIPAL HUMANE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S3558 revises the enforcement of animal cruelty laws in the state by transferring the power of humane law enforcement for the New Jersey Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (“NJSPCA”) and County Societies For The Prevention Of Cruelty To Animals (“County Societies”) to a County Prosecutor Animal Cruelty Task Force in each county of the state and a Municipal Humane Law Enforcement Officer shall be appointed in each municipality; and

WHEREAS, it is directed that each police department shall name Humane Law Enforcement Officers on their force to enforce, investigate, and sign complaints concerning any violation of the animal cruelty laws of the state or ordinances of the municipality, and to act as an officer for the detection, apprehension, and arrest of offenders against the animal welfare and animal cruelty laws of the State and ordinances of the municipality.

NOW, THEREFORE be it resolved by the Barnegat Township Governing Body that Patrol Officer Brett Taylor be appointed as Municipal Humane Law Enforcement Officer of the Township of Barnegat, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, with no compensation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Municipal Humane Law Enforcement Officers shall report annually to the County Prosecutor Animal Cruelty Task Force on the number of complaints received for each offense under Chapter 22 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, and the number of cases referred to the County Prosecutor Task Force in the previous year.
