Linda Kropf- Discussed legislation about Health Care when out of the state. Gave a report on the Water Sewer department.

Pat Pipi- Gave a code enforcement report. He also mention the Barnegat Waretown Chamber of Commerce hosting the Classic Car Show. Also invited the community to attend the local senior softball games.

Al Bille- Discussed the average tax increase this year, which is less than last year. He and the Mayor met with Freeholder, Ginny Haines, and she came through for the paving of West Bay Avenue, to Fourth Street in fall of 2019. He also mentioned the air conditioning issues in town hall and hot working conditions and complemented the employees who worked through it.

John Novak- Gave a police report and kudos the Barnegat Police Department for their hard work and efforts. He also mentioned Barnegat Night Out.

Mayor's Report:

Al Cirulli- Talked about Puppy Paws and Maria Cymanski's efforts. He did meet with the Dunfee School about the Adopt a Street Program. They are very dedicated and he thinks this will take off. The Public Works facility is moving along and hoping for it to be complete by October 1st. He also reiterated the Barnegat Night Out event occurring tonight. He gave thanks to the PBA for setting this event up. Mentioned the Neighborhood Watch block party and gave Laura Zinger thanks for putting it together and talked about the Hot Rods and Heroes event. He made comments about the LGBT curriculum that will be implemented in the 2020-2021 school year.

John Novak- Commented the parents should have rights and some control on things they want their children to learn about the LGBT.

Bridget Nunn, 15 Ryan Rd.- Mention she is a licensed mental health clinician, she stated she doesn't agree with the Mayors statements. The community needs to be mindful of the position as well as compassionate and tolerant.

George Fedorczyk, 131 Rockrimmon Blvd.- He is appalled about the mayors comments. He thinks the Mayor should see the curriculum before he speaks about the LGBT curriculum.

Peg Houle, 10 Rockland Street- Outraged about the mayor's speech.

Dwight McBee, 7 Ridgeway Rd.- Applauded the Mayor for educating the public about the changes being made in the school system.

Joshua Armstrong, 28 Gunning River Rd.- Thank the mayor for letting him know what's going on in the schools system, and he believes he should have a choice on what his children are learning.

Marianne Clemente, 565 East Bay Ave.- Stated the Mayor should not be preaching from the dais, church and state are separate. She mention a separate issue, as citizen she is appalled that our congressional representative was not allowed to speak at the Mirage Development.

Bill Neyenhouse, 9 Maple Ave.- Discussed the property on the north side of the beach being acquired by the town, to help preserve the beach and help with the weather impacts. They could extend the boardwalk and ADA ramps.

John Novak- Commented that the boardwalk should already be ADA compliant.

Al Bille- Commented on the beach and it's never at capacity. Most visitors are not local, they are out of state. He sees no reason to expand the beach. He said the land next to it could be a good ratable.

Marty Lisella- Stated property may be under contract already.

Jean Gurkas, 200 Rahway Rd.- She would like to see an architectural design of the new town hall. She brought up the Silver Liners being moved to the firehouse and it's been a year. She also mentioned the sidewalk issues in front of her home.

Al Cirulli- The Department of Public Works needs to be finished.
