Call to Order the August 2, 2022 Township Committee Meeting:

Committee Reports: Pipi, Marte, Farmer, Bille

Pat Pipi: Went over Code Enforcement report. John and Andy issued 11 re-inspections, 50 summons and 195 warning stickers. They are doing a great job! Mentioned that the beaches are very clean.

Joseph Marte: Mentioned that the police answered 1,374 calls for the month of July. Recognized Officer of the month – Lt. Jeff Ryan. With all his effort he launched a new Marine Unit. Received a 2014 Caroline Skiff and trailer from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection at no cost. Lt. Jeff Ryan coordinated donations from local businesses to get the boat up and running and to make the Marine Unit a reality.

Bill Farmer: Spoke about the water/sewer report. Total number of work order as of July 31st is 122. Year to date work order is 642.

Al Bille: Talked about our 2nd annual firework display held on July 9th. Turned out to be a great event! Also, there was a concert held at the docks at the same time. All lots were cleared out in 24 minutes and 24 seconds. A special thank you to our school officials. There will be 3 movies held at the High School sponsored by Van Dyk on August 9th, 16th and 23rd. One of our parks was vandalized and thanked our DPW for fixing it. Did not cost the town anything. Municipal taxes went up in Lacey by \$39, Brick - \$48, Stafford - \$58 and Barnegat - \$22.29.

<u>Mayor's Report – Alfonso Cirulli</u>- Commend the B.O.E. for their dedication and allowing the town for the use of events held at the High School. The school cooperation is fantastic! Fire Department Report – Total call for the year is 313. Stressed to residents to change the batteries in your smoke detectors every year. Thanked our Fire Department Volunteers. Voting on signs, a non-binding resolution. Investigating Pinewood Estates – County inspectors have gone out and permits were issued. Now checking to see exactly what has been done. Doing everything to protect our residents. Issues with rent leveling ordinance. Mr. Dasti mentioned some complaints from residents of Pinewood Estates and Brighton regarding fees on rent to new tenants.

Major issues on Paramount Escapes. Mr. Dasti explains the process and that the developer has not applied for the TCO. Thanked Rico's office for getting people in their homes. Last month spoke about the water pressure in town, working on Mirage water tower today. Also, working towards another water tower by Sea Crest Pines.

He knows it is hard to get message out and the only way is by campaign signs. He had picked up 98% of signs by noon after election. Suggested to pick 4 – 6 public places in town and each candidate put 1 sign out. Asked the Mayor to please consider at least one area.

Eileen Miller: 22 Moonlight Dr. – One of the residents who is trying to get in their home at Paramount. Thanked Mr. Dasti for a copy of letter. Wants to know what do we do? Mr. Dasti advised to speak to her attorney. The builder has to apply for the TCO. Town has laid out the groundwork. It's on the builder. Asking if we are fining the builder as of now? Mr. Dasti applied that the Township can by law issue violations. The goal is to get you in your home.

John Murrin: 38 Pierhead Dr. - Last meeting suggested moving the fireworks to save couple of dollars, rethinking and feels it's not a good idea. Keep it as is. Thank you for putting out a non-binding resolution. Update on new building. Kurt Otto explains that it is a struggle but it is moving along.

David Voorhees: 89 Gunning River Rd. - Complimented the clerk. Thank you for getting the town clock fixed on Route 9.

Rick Edelman: 131 Cypress Lane – Thanked the committee for helping them in Pinewood Estates. There will be a meeting held on August 13th in the community to address few problems.
