ORDINANCE NO. 2026-8

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF A PORTION OF LOT 4 IN BLOCK 250 (360 NORTH MAIN STREET) BARNEGAT, NEW JERSEY N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the Township of Barnegat, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey (“the Township”), is the owner of Block 250, Lot 4 on the tax map of the Township of Barnegat; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located the CV Village Commercial Zone; and

WHEREAS, the Property is an undersized and the Township is desirous of subdividing and selling a portion of the property which is an approximate 1,465 square foot area which is depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the sale of the portion of the property will return the property to the tax rolls of the Township and create revenue for the Township; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of the sale of a portion of Lot 4, the purchaser shall subdivide the portion of Lot 4 to be sold and then file a lot consolidation deed with the new parcel to be consolidated with the property owned by the purchaser; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to offer the property for sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13 authorizes the Township to sell municipally owned property at a private sale or a public sale to an owner of real property contiguous thereto where the Township owned property is less than the minimum size required for development under the municipal zoning ordinance and is without any capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5) further provides for a sale to the owner of the real property contiguous to the real property being sold; provided that that the real property being

sold is less than the minimum size required for development under the municipal zoning ordinance and is without any capital improvement thereon.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED on this 7th day of April, 2026, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Barnegat, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. The Township is the owner of the land located in the Township of Barnegat known as Lot 4 in Block 250, otherwise known as 360 North Main Street, Barnegat, New Jersey (the “Property”). The Property is located in the CV Village Commercial Zone and subject to all easements and restrictions of record and not of record.

SECTION 2. The Township Committee has determined it to be in the public interest to sell said property at a private sale to an owner of real property contiguous thereto in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5).

SECTION 3. N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5) further provides that the sale shall not be for less than fair market value of said real property.

SECTION 4. The Township Committee declares the property to be surplus and not needed for public use.

SECTION 5. The following conditions for the sale of the property shall apply:

- (a) The minimum bid for the property shall be \$750.00.
- (b) Full payment of the purchase price shall be received within 30 days of the date of the acceptance of the bid. The successful bidder will be required to pay, either by cash or bank check, the deposit in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the minimum price of the bid at the close of bidding with the balance to be paid by either cash or bank check. The successful bidder shall pay all legal expenses including, but not limited to, Township legal fees, the pro rata cost of advertisement, recording fees, realty transfer fee and all other reasonable fees and costs incurred as part of the consideration on the date of closing.

- (c) The property is being sold in an “as is” condition. The successful bidder is responsible for conducting any and all inspections and testing of the property at its own cost and expense. The property is sold subject to any and all conditions, including but not limited to, title issues, environmental issues, existing encumbrances, liens, easements, zoning ordinances, other restrictions of record, such facts as an accurate survey would reveal, any future or present assessment for the construction of improvements benefiting the property. A survey of the property may be conducted by any prospective bidder at its discretion, as part of its due diligence.
- (d) The land to be sold is undersized for development under the Township zoning ordinance. Bids will be limited to contiguous landowners only. The successful bidder shall consolidate the property purchase with other contiguous lot or lots so as to be part of a reconfigured lot in conformance with the zoning requirements. This requirement shall be incorporated into the Quit Claim Deed as a deed restriction. The contiguous landowners for the purpose of this sale shall be limited to the legal owner of record as of the date of sale. Contract purchasers and tax lien owners are not deemed contiguous for the purpose of this sale.
- (e) Should the property be developed, it shall be done in accordance with all applicable Township ordinances as well as County and State laws, rules, and regulations. No representation, express or implied, is made that the successful bidder on an undersized lot will be able to secure a variance to develop, construct, or otherwise utilize any undersized lots hereby being sold.
- (f) The Deed must be recorded within 30 days of closing or title to the property shall automatically revert back to the Township of Barnegat without the necessity of entry or re-entry.
- (g) With respect to the sale of the property herein, no real estate commission is owed.
- (h) The Deed given by the Township for the property will be a Quit Claim Deed. No title contingencies or conditions are permitted.
- (i) A condition of the sale of the property shall be that the winning bidder/purchaser shall file a subdivision application with the Barnegat Township Planning Board and receive subdivision approval to subdivide the portion to be purchased and subdivide

same from Lot 4 and the new parcel shall be consolidated by way of a lot consolidation deed with the property owned by the winning bidder. All such filings and approvals shall be at the sole cost of the winning bidder of the property.

- (j) The Township reserves the right to accept the highest responsive bid if equal to or greater than the minimum bid price or to reject all bids and not to award to the highest bidder. The Township reserves the right to waive any and all defects in formalities in any proposal, and to accept or reject the highest responsive bid deemed to be in the best interest of the Township.
- (k) In the event the Township cannot convey marketable title to said premises its sole liability shall be to return without interest all monies paid by the purchaser to the Township. This obligation will not survive the closing of title. It is suggested and recommended that the potential bidders perform title searches and/or last owner and lien searches on the properties they are interested in bidding upon prior to the date of bid submission so that the potential bidder may be adequately apprised of any encumbrances or restrictions of record effecting the use and germane of property. The Township of Barnegat shall not be responsible for the cost associated with such searches in the event the Township of Barnegat is unable to convey title and/or if a bid is rejected.

SECTION 6. Notice of the Township's intention to sell the property and the minimum bid price therefore shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested to all property owners listed on the municipal tax records who own properties contiguous to the property. It shall be the responsibility of the successful bidder to pay all closing costs and expenses incurred by both the Township of Barnegat and the successful bidder relating to the sale, transfer and exchange of the property.

SECTION 7. The Sale shall be advertised in the official newspaper of the Township by two insertions, at least once a week for two consecutive weeks, the last publication to be no later than seven (7) days prior to the sale.


SECTION 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 10. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN AND STATE OF
NEW JERSEY ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 14 OF
THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED
“BARNEGAT VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY NO. 1”**

WHEREAS, there has been established with the Township of Barnegat, a fire company known as the Barnegat Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 (hereinafter “BVFC”); and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Barnegat, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1.

§14-1. Establishment. There is, and has been established, within the Township of Barnegat a fire company, known as the Barnegat Township Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 (hereinafter “BVFC”) which was created and established and is hereby continued to be recognized by the Township of Barnegat. No other firefighting organization is to be formed within the Township without consent of the Township Committee. BVFC must comply with all the requirements of this article and any rules or regulations promulgated hereunder.

§14-2. Line Officers. The line officers of the BVFC shall consist of a Chief, Deputy Chief, Captain, and Lieutenants shall be appointed by the Township Committee as provided by law.

§14-3. Company Bylaws. Any amendments thereafter, of the BVFC shall be provided to the Township Clerk.

§14-4. Reports to Township Committee. It shall be the responsibility of the Chief of the BVFC to make all reports to the Township Committee on an annual basis as requested by the Township Committee.

§14-5. Ownership of Quarters. The Township shall retain ownership and control over the quarters entrusted to the BVFC.

§14-6. Expenses. In the Township's sole discretion, the Township may supply funding to the BVFC on an annual basis, based upon the needs of the BVFC.

§14-7. Purchasing and title of equipment. The Township shall retain title to all equipment purchased with funds supplied by the Township Committee for the purpose of purchasing such equipment. However, nothing shall preclude the BVFC from purchasing its own fire equipment or other personal property and retaining title thereof; provided, however, that if the Township shall have a financial responsibility toward the purchase, operation or maintenance of such items, prior formal approval of the Township Committee for such purchase shall be required.

§14-8. Duties of Fire Chief.

A. The Chief shall be in full command and complete control at all fires and during the period of all alarms and shall be held accountable for his/her actions to the Township Committee and shall make written and verbal reports as the Township Committee may require. All other line officers shall be accountable to the Chief except when any officers are acting as Chief in his/her absence.

B. The Chief shall formulate rules and regulations to govern the operation of the BVFC, such rules and regulations being subject to review and approval by the Township Committee and shall be responsible to the Township Committee for the morale and general efficiency of the BVFC.

C. The Chief or line officer designated by him/her shall, at least once a month, conduct suitable drills or instructions in the operation of firefighting apparatus and equipment, first aid and rescue work, salvage, a study of buildings presenting unusual fire problems, water supply and other matters generally considered essential to good firemanship and safety of life and property from fire.

D. The Chief or any line officer designated by him/her is hereby required to report to the Township Committee any suspected crime of arson and shall render all possible assistance to the Township Committee and the Chief of Police in investigating the cause, origin, and circumstances of all fires of questionable origin.

E. The Chief shall cause to be kept complete records of all fires, apparatus and minor equipment, personnel and other information about the work of the Fire Company.

F. The Chief shall report monthly to the Township Public Safety Liaison and/or the Fire Safety Director, the number and types of fires during the month, the number and purpose of all other runs made, the number of members and man-hours involved in responding to each fire or other run, and the estimated loss involved in all building fires.

G. The Chief shall make a complete annual report to the Township Committee, such report to include information as specified in Subsection F of this section, together with comparative data for previous years and recommendations for improving the effectiveness of the BVFC.

H. The Chief shall be responsible to transmit to the Township Committee, on or before November 15 of each year, a proposed annual budget.

§14-9. Recognized standards and practices. The recognized standards and practices for fire prevention shall be held to mean the standard practices and requirements

as set forth in Chapter 46 of the Township Code entitled “Fire Prevention” and applicable state regulations.

§14-10. Membership.

A. Every person seeking to join the BVFC shall make application to the BVFC in accordance with the rules and regulations thereof, and the bylaws of the BVFC. After passing a physical examination by a practicing physician in the State of New Jersey, certifying that the applicant is fit for firefighting duties, said applicant shall be appointed by the Township Committee to become a member in good standing of the BVFC. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age. The Applicant shall be required to complete a physical examination every five (5) years by a practicing physician in the State of New Jersey certifying that the Applicant is fit for firefighting duties.

B. It shall be the duty of the active members to participate in drills and instructions and to aid the Chief and the other line officers to the best of their ability in the prevention and control of fire and the protection of life and property within the Township of Barnegat and wherever the BVFC may have cause to conduct operations.

C. All members of the BVFC shall serve without compensation. However, said members shall be subject to call-out fees and LOSAP payments as approved by the Township Committee.

D. An exempt firemen's certificate shall be issued by the Township Committee, in the form and manner provided by law, to all members of the BVFC lawfully entitled to receive the same.

§14-11. Equipment.

A. Recommendations for the purchase of apparatus and equipment needed to maintain the effectiveness of the BVFC and properly protect life and property from fire shall be made by the Chief to the Mayor and Township Committee.

B. All equipment of the BVFC shall be secured and safely housed by the BVFC at the BVFC firehouse.

C. Except as may be authorized by the Township Committee, no person shall use any fire apparatus or equipment of the Township for any private purpose. No person shall willfully and without authority to take away or conceal any article used in any way by the BVFC.

D. No person except authorized employees of the Township of Barnegat shall enter any place where fire apparatus is housed or handle any equipment belonging to the Township unless accompanied by or having the special permission of an officer or authorized member of the BVFC.

E. The Chief is hereby authorized to extend aid to neighboring communities upon request for fire protection or to establish a mutual aid system.

F. No apparatus of the Township shall be hired out or permitted to leave the Township of Barnegat without consent of the Township, except in response to a call for aid in a neighboring community or on official business. No apparatus is to leave the Township on official business without the consent of the Chief or highest-ranking line officer available. The line officer in charge of the BVFC shall have power to assign equipment for response to calls for outside aid in accordance with Subsection F of this section, and in other cases, only when the absence of such equipment in his judgment will not jeopardize fire protection in the Township of Barnegat.

§14-12. Removal of Officers or Members. For good cause, the Township Committee may reprimand, suspend, or remove from office the Fire Chief or any officer or members of the BVFC.

§14-13. Fire Safety Director. In the discretion of the Township Committee, the Township Committee may appoint a Fire Safety Director, to oversee the operations of the

BVFC and control the general affairs of the BVFC as permitted by law. The Fire Safety Director may be an employee of the Township and shall serve and be appointed on an annual basis.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2026-11

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS VEHICLES & EQUIPMENT FOR THE TOWNSHIP'S PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, APPROPRIATING \$450,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$427,500 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Township of Barnegat, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Township"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$450,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$50,000 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$427,500, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the acquisition of various vehicle & equipment for the Township's Public Works Department, including but not limited to: a new 2026 Case Wheel Loader; 2026 F-600 Ford Rack Truck with plow, and a F250 Ford Pickup Truck together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, and all work, materials, equipment, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Township Chief Financial Officer, as finally approved by the governing body of the Township.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$450,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$450,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriations herein made therefor.

The excess of the appropriation of \$450,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$50,000 down payment for said purposes.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Township, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is **8 years**.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$575,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding **\$22,500** for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the Township are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Township reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

Section 6. The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Township for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and, unless paid from other sources, the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-12

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN AND STATE OF
NEW JERSEY REPEALING AND REPLACING
CHAPTER 55-126.3 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE
ENTITLED "BULKHEADING"**

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Barnegat, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 55-126.3 of the Township Code entitled "Bulkheading" is hereby replaced in its entirety and shall read as follows:

SECTION 1.

§55-126.3 BULKHEADING

A. Definitions. As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

LAGOON

Any natural, man-made, or man-improved body of water, providing access for watercraft to any property.

MARINE BULKHEAD

Any bulkhead or retaining wall which retains earth (or other materials) on one side and is exposed to water in a lagoon or other body of water along all or part of any of its boundary lines.

TOWNSHIP BULKHEAD ENGINEER OR MUNICIPAL ENGINEER.

A New-Jersey-licensed professional engineer appointed by the Township Committee to review and approve or deny applications submitted under this article.

TOWNSHIP BULKHEAD INSPECTOR

An inspector appointed by the Township Committee to inspect the condition and construction of bulkheads under this article and to enforce the provisions of this article or, in the alternative, the Township Engineer, Township Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Official.

WATERFRONT LOT

Any lot which has a lagoon or other body of water along or part of any of its boundary lines.

B. Permits required.

- (1) No marine bulkhead shall be altered, repaired, constructed, reconstructed, or installed, and no fill shall be placed on any waterfront lot, unless and until a bulkhead permit has been obtained from the Township of Barnegat.
- (2) No marine bulkhead shall be altered, repaired, constructed, reconstructed, or installed, including repairs of less than 50%, and no fill shall be placed on any waterfront lot, unless and until a zoning permit has been obtained from the Township of Barnegat.
- (3) No marine bulkhead shall be altered, repaired, constructed, reconstructed, or installed, and no fill shall be placed on any waterfront lot, unless and until a permit has been obtained from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, as applicable and from any other governmental agency with jurisdiction.

C. Applications for permits.

- (1) Applications for a bulkhead permit shall be submitted to the Township Construction Office and shall be on the form provided by the Township.
- (2) All proposed new, altered, replacement, or reconstructed marine bulkheads in the Township of Barnegat shall be designed by a professional engineer licensed to practice in the State of New Jersey and/or homeowner.
- (3) Applications shall be accompanied by signed and sealed plans and specifications, showing the size, shape, configuration, materials, dimensions, and location of the bulkhead(s), including existing and proposed bulkheads.
- (4) All plans shall be based upon an accurate, current survey of the premises prepared by a New-Jersey-licensed land surveyor.
- (5) Applications shall be accompanied by fees established by the Township Committee of the Township of Barnegat.

- (6) Applications shall be accompanied by copies of applicable permits from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection regarding the proposed bulkhead, and/or other documentation verifying that the proposed bulkhead has been approved by the department or is in conformance with the department's rules and regulations governing bulkheads.

D. Permit approvals.

- (1) The Township Bulkhead Engineer shall review the application and plans and grant or deny the application within 10 business days upon receipt of a complete application.
- (2) The review by the Township Bulkhead Engineer shall be in conformity with the chapter, consistent with the minimum standards and specifications contained herein.

E. Conformance to standards.

- (1) The design engineer shall certify on the plan the type of water (i.e., freshwater or saltwater) to which the exposed side of the marine bulkhead will be exposed.
- (2) All bulkhead designs shall take into account the following minimum factors:
 - (a) Soil type(s) and conditions in front of wall;
 - (b) Soil type(s) and conditions behind the wall;
 - (c) Water depth in front of the wall (to mud line and to firm bottom, with allowance for future dredging, if needed);
 - (d) Water depth behind the wall;
 - (e) Tide fluctuations;
 - (f) Sheet pile and face pile (if used) embedment depth;
 - (g) Sheet pile and face pile (if used) exposed length above bottom of lagoon and above water;
 - (h) Sheet pile anchorage conditions behind wall;
 - (i) Currents, scour and wave action potential;
 - (j) Use of wall and land behind the wall (boat anchorage davit attachments, special loadings, driveways, buildings, surcharges, etc.);

- (k) Drainage behind the wall;
 - (l) Wall backfill materials;
 - (m) Slope behind the wall;
 - (n) Type and strength of materials used in wall; and
 - (o) If deadmen drag and anchor piles are eliminated, an alternative design must be submitted.
- (3) All marine bulkheads shall be generally of the deep-water, anchored (or “navy”) type unless otherwise approved by the Township Engineer, which typically consists of the following elements:
- (a) Face piles (tapered, round piles seaward of all other bulkhead components);
 - (b) Sheet piles (sheathing);
 - (c) Walers (horizontal beams between face piles and sheet piles):
 - (i) One at the top of the wall;
 - (ii) One at low tide (if needed for design conditions); and
 - (iii) Intermediate (if needed for design conditions).
 - (d) Steel tie rods with ogee washers and nuts, through the face piles and sheet piles and tied into deadmen, drag, and/or anchor piling;
 - (e) Key logs, deadmen, drag, and/or anchor piles for tie rod anchorage; and
 - (f) Wall caps.
- (4) If the bulkhead will be constructed of interlocking vinyl sheet piles and will utilize a design in which face piles will not be used, the design shall be subject to the approval by the Township Bulkhead

Engineer. Such bulkheads, however, shall include all other bulkhead elements listed in this article for marine bulkheads.

- (5) All marine bulkheads shall be installed by contractors who are equipped, experienced, qualified, and competent to install such structures and shall be constructed in a good workmanlike manner.
- (6) All development on waterfront properties abutting lagoons shall provide for marine bulkheading along the entire lagoon frontage. Only marine bulkheads are permitted along such lagoon frontages; in no case shall bank slopes, riprap, revetments, sod, vegetated or other types of bank stabilization be permitted.
- (7) Only clean fill shall be used for fill behind or on the landward side of the bulkhead and no construction debris.
- (8) All bulkheads shall be constructed to tie into existing bulkheads on either or both sides, if any exist, or shall be constructed with returns (at 90° to the main bulkhead) into the protected property, to prevent flanking of the main bulkhead. If the requirements of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection do not permit either of these alternatives, then the department's determination shall govern.
- (9) Wood that has been pressure-treated with chromated copper arsenate (CCA) is no longer permitted for use as sheet piles in any marine bulkhead constructed or reconstructed in Barnegat Township if commercial production of such wood has been discontinued.
 - (a) Thereafter, CCA shall only be permitted for:
 - (i) Use as walers, face piles, deadmen, anchor piles; or
 - (ii) For repair of sheet piles in an existing marine bulkhead which was originally constructed of such materials.
 - (b) In the event the repair of an existing marine bulkhead will constitute more than 50% of the surface area of the existing sheet piles exposed between the upper and the lowest water in the bulkhead, then CCA-treated wood shall not be permitted for use therein.

F. Bulkhead penetration.

- (1) No stormwater piping connected to a roadway drainage system may penetrate a bulkhead unless there is an authorized easement by the Township of Barnegat or County of Ocean.
- (2) Commencement of construction; notification; inspections.
 - (a) No construction shall commence before and unless a permit for construction has been obtained in accordance with the requirements of this article.
 - (b) The permittee shall notify the Township Bulkhead Inspector at least two business days before construction is to commence or recommence on any bulkhead for which a permit has been issued. In the event of extreme weather conditions, the permittee may backfill the work completed to date; however, the permittee shall first notify the Township Bulkhead Inspector and expose the completed work, to the satisfaction of the Township Bulkhead Inspector, prior to closeout of any permit.
 - (c) Any work performed without notification to the Township Bulkhead Inspector is subject to removal by and at the cost and expense of the permittee.
 - (d) The Township Bulkhead Inspector shall inspect the materials delivered to the job site and verify that they are in conformance with the permit issued for that work, in size, quantity, and quality. If such materials do not conform to permit requirements, they shall be marked as "rejected" and removed from the job site by the permittee and shall not be incorporated into the bulkhead construction.
 - (e) The Township Bulkhead Inspector shall make periodic visits to the job site to verify that the work is proceeding in accordance with permit requirements and to document construction of deadmen, anchor piles and tie rods is in conformance with design plans. Final backfill of anchor systems shall not commence until the Township Bulkhead Inspector has inspected and approved the anchor system installation.
 - (f) The permittee and the contractor shall provide safe and adequate access to the site of the work for the Township Bulkhead Inspector for purposes of making the required inspections.

G. Final inspection.

- (1) The permittee shall notify the Township Inspector of the completion of the work done under the permit issued.
- (2) The Township Inspector shall, within three business days of the notification, make an inspection of the completed work to determine if it conforms to the approved plans issued with the permit.
- (3) If it is in conformance, the permittee will be so advised, and the permit file shall be marked as "completed." If it is not in conformance, the permittee will be so advised, and will be provided with a list of specific deficiencies requiring correction. The permittee shall then advise the Township Bulkhead Inspector when corrections have been made, and a reinspection will be made.

H. Utilities.

- (1) It is the responsibility of the permittee to protect all existing utilities at the bulkhead site.
- (2) The permittee shall obtain current utility mark-out from all applicable utilities prior to commencement of construction.

I. Minimum standards.

- (1) Materials.
 - (a) All materials incorporated into bulkheads constructed within the Township shall conform to the requirements contained herein.
 - (b) Wood that has been treated with chromated copper arsenate (CCA) shall not be used as sheet piles in any bulkhead regulated by these requirements.
 - (c) Only vinyl shall be used as sheet piles in any bulkhead regulated by these requirements.
 - (d) Wood.
 - (i) Material. All wood used in marine bulkhead construction shall be treated Southern pine (or a wood of equivalent strength and durability approved by the Township Engineer), and graded by a recognized lumber grading agency, meeting the following minimum standards:

- [1] Round piles, ASTM D 25, minimum ten-inch butt, eight-inch tip diameter, natural taper spaced a maximum of six feet on center and driven a minimum of eight feet into solid bottom, or greater if determined by the design engineer.
- [2] Square or sawn piling, not permitted.
- [3] Waler. Marine framing grade number two, minimum four inches by six inches with a maximum spacing of four feet between top and bottom walers, and with intermediate walers if required by the design engineer.
- [4] Sheet piles. Vinyl, see §55-126.3.I.(1)(e). Length shall be determined by the depth of the water six feet from the bulkhead and shall be driven a minimum of five feet into solid bottom or greater if determined by the design engineer.
- [5] Wallcaps. ACQ, PVC, Composite.
- [6] Anchor piles. ASTM D 25 minimum eight-inch tip diameter, natural taper, and length and depth as determined by the design engineer.
- [7] Key logs. Minimum six-inch by eight-inch or eight-inch diameter and 16 feet long, continuous for the entire length of the bulkhead with four-foot overlaps.

(ii) Preservative. All wood used in bulkhead construction shall be pressure-treated in accordance with the following specifications:

- [1] Round piles (including deadmen, anchor, or drag piles). Saltwater 2.5 CCA, AWPA C3 and C18.
- [2] Walers. Saltwater 2.5 CCA, AWPA C2 and C.
- [3] Sheet piles. Saltwater 2.5 CCA, AWPA C2 and 18.

[4] Wallcaps/topcaps. ACQ.

(iii) Installation. All wood materials shall be installed in strict accordance with the specifications, recommendations, and installation instructions of the Southern Pine Council (SPC) as contained in the current edition of the SPC Marine Construction Manual. The design engineer shall certify that the particular type, length, thickness, and shape of bulkhead is adequate and appropriate for the loads and conditions anticipated at the site.

(e) Vinyl.

(i) Vinyl used in bulkheading shall be extruded from ridge, impact modified, weatherable, UV resistant, polyvinyl chloride (PVC). Such PVC shall meet the minimum requirements of ASTM D-4216 for cell classification, current edition, and shall be guaranteed in writing by the manufacturer to resist rot, decay, marine borer, termite, and ultraviolet deterioration on a prorated basis for a minimum of 50 years from the date of installation.

(ii) Vinyl bulkheads shall consist of the following minimum components: interlocking PVC sheet piles; one or more horizontal beams as wafers; and an anchoring system consisting of tie rods and anchors.

(iii) Components of vinyl bulkhead systems which will consist of wood or metal parts shall conform to the standards of this article for wood or metal components.

(iv) The design engineer shall certify that the particular type, length, thickness and sectional shape of vinyl sheet pile used is adequate and appropriate for the loads and conditions anticipated at the site.

(v) All vinyl materials shall be installed in strict accordance with the specifications, recommendations, and installation instructions of the vinyl sheet pile manufacturer.

(f) Steel.

(i) Galvanized steel.

- [1] All tie rods shall be ASTM A-36 steel one-inch minimum diameter, hot dipped galvanized steel, per ASTM A-153 with two ounces of zinc per square foot, with matching hexagonal nuts (ASTM A-307) and cast-iron ogee washer (ASTM A-47).
- [2] All bolts shall be 3/4-inch minimum diameter, hot-forged bolts with hexagonal heads (ASTM A-307), with matching hexagonal nuts and washers.
- [3] Stainless steel. If stainless steel is used for tie rods or hardware, it shall be 300 series stainless steel, with matching hexagonal nuts and washers.
- [4] All hardware (including plates and turnbuckles) shall be of the same materials and protective coatings as the tie rods.

J. Maintenance and duty to repair.

- (1) All private bulkheads within the Township of Barnegat shall be maintained so that they shall not pose a danger to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Township.
- (2) All bulkheads shall be kept in a state of repair which will prevent erosion or damage to abutting, adjacent, or adjoining properties or the lagoon on which it fronts.
- (3) Whenever a bulkhead has deteriorated to such a degree that it poses a danger to the property, or to abutting, adjacent or adjoining properties, or to the lagoon on which it fronts, the owner shall be required to make the necessary repairs to correct such conditions.
- (4) The indications that a bulkhead has deteriorated shall include (but not be limited to):
 - (a) Members which are bowed, bent, leaning, leaking;
 - (b) Holes in the sheet piles;
 - (c) Settlement or sinkholes in the ground landward of the bulkhead;
 - (d) Bulkhead backfill deposited in the lagoon seaward of the bulkhead; and

- (e) Other indications that it is structurally unsound or unsafe.
- (5) When notified by the Township Engineer, Township Bulkhead Inspector or Code Enforcement Official of a deteriorated bulkhead, a property owner shall submit a plan of corrective action to the Township no later than 60 days from the receipt of the notice.
- (6) Upon approval of the plan of corrective action by the Township Bulkhead Engineer, the property owner shall complete all necessary repairs within 120 days.
- (7) If permits are required from state or federal government agencies, such permits shall be immediately applied for prior to Township approval. In the event the property owner fails to submit a corrective action plan or fails to implement such plan following approval by the Township, he shall be liable for the penalties and violations contained herein.

K. Violations, penalties and fees.

- (1) Anyone violating any of the provisions of this article shall be subject to a fine not to exceed the sum of \$1,250 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 90 days for each violation. Each day of a violation shall be a separate offense and shall be punishable as a separate offense.
- (2) A fee of \$450 shall be paid by the applicant to the Township of Barnegat to cover the administrative costs for processing and reviewing the bulkhead permit and inspecting the work (exclusive of any required zoning permit fees).

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of _____, 2026, by and BETWEEN: **THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT**, having its offices located at **900 WEST BAY AVENUE, BARNEGAT, N.J. 08005** hereinafter referred to as “Municipality”.

AND: THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, having its offices at Administration Building, **101 HOOPER AVENUE, TOMS RIVER, NEW JERSEY 08754**, hereinafter referred as “County”.

WHEREAS, by resolution of the Township Committee of BARNEGAT, dated _____, authorization was given to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with the County of Ocean for the FY26 Traffic Enforcement Program Grant; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant is run by the Ocean County Sheriff’s Office (hereinafter referred to as “Sheriff’s Office”) in an effort to improve the safety of motorists and pedestrians on our county’s roads and highways; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Enforcement Grant Program receives funding from the State of New Jersey and the County of Ocean; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff’s Office and the Municipality have determined it to be in their mutual interest for the Municipality to designate Police Officers to be assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., authorizes local units as defined in the Act to enter into joint agreements for the provision of governmental services; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality wishes to enter into an Agreement with the County for the purpose of setting forth the terms and conditions regarding the assignment of Police Officers employed by the Municipality to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth pursuant to the authority provided by law, the parties hereby agree to and with each other as follows:

- 1) **DESIGNATION OF POLICE OFFICERS FOR ASSIGNMENT TO THE TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM GRANT.** Upon request by the County, the Municipality shall designate Police Officers to be assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant detail.
- 2) **RESPONSIBILITIES OF MUNICIPALITY.** The Municipality agrees that it shall have the following responsibilities during the term of this Agreement:
 - a. The Municipality will be responsible for assigning Police Officers to conduct high visibility traffic enforcement along County Route 539.
 - b. The Municipality will be responsible for submitting reimbursement requests to the Sheriff's Office for overtime expenses for services performed by assigned officers as follows:
 - (October 1, 2025 – September 30, 2026) due September 1, 2026.
- 3) **RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY.** The County agrees that it shall have the following responsibilities during the term of this Agreement:
 - a. The County will forward to the Municipality a schedule of dates and times to conduct the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant event.
- 4) **COMPENSATION.** The County shall reimburse the Municipality for overtime expenses incurred by Police Officers in their department assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant for services performed hereunder. The hourly rate of overtime reimbursement shall not exceed sixty dollars (\$70.00) per hour; until designated grant funding for overtime reimbursement has been exhausted. Compensation of overtime hours shall not exceed the hours of the scheduled event as defined in Section 3a. The Traffic Safety Officer's department will pay any income tax or other taxes required to be paid from each Officer's salary received pursuant to this Agreement.
- 5) **TERM.** This Agreement shall be retroactive from October 1, 2025 and shall continue in full force and effect until September 30, 2026.
- 6) **TERMINATION.** Either party to this Agreement may, by giving written notice to the other party, terminate this Agreement.

- 7) **RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES.** The Police Officers assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant pursuant to this Agreement are not and shall not be considered agents or employees of the County.
- 8) **VIOLATIONS OF RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENT POLICE OFFICER.** During the time of their assignment to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant, the Police Officer shall continue to be governed by the rules and regulations of their respective Municipal Police Department. In the event of any violation of the rules and regulations, the Police Officer committing the violation may be returned to the Municipal Police Department for appropriate disciplinary action.
- 9) **VIOLATIONS OF RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SHERIFF'S OFFICE.** The Sheriff's Office shall assume responsibility for the actions of their Sheriff's Officer(s) assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Program Grant and shall handle disciplinary action for the violation of the rules and regulations of the Sheriff's Office. In its discretion, the Sheriff's Office shall investigate any alleged violations of its rules and regulations and violations of public trust. The Sheriff's Office shall file a written report of any alleged violations with the Chief of Police of the Municipal Police Department along with a report of the investigation, any conclusions reached and subsequent disciplinary action, if any.
- 10) **ASSIGNABILITY.** The Municipality shall not assign or transfer any of the work or services to be performed hereunder of any other interest in this Agreement without the prior written approval of the County.
- 11) **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement contains the entire Agreement between the parties, and no modification hereof shall be effective unless in writing, signed by the party to be charged herewith. This Agreement shall supersede any other understanding or correspondence that may have been exchanged between the parties on the subject matter hereof.
- 12) **BINDING EFFECT.** This Agreement has been duly entered into and constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of the County and the Municipality, enforceable in accordance with its terms, and it shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.



RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, SUPPORTING THE SAFEGUARD AMERICAN VOTER ELIGIBILITY (SAVE) ACT

WHEREAS: the Integrity, accuracy, and public confidence in the electoral process are fundamental to the preservation of representative democracy in the United States; and

WHEREAS: the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility Act (the SAVE Act) is federal legislation intended to ensure that only United States citizens are permitted to register and vote in federal elections; and

WHEREAS: the SAVE Act proposes to require documentary proof of United States citizenship for voter registration in federal elections, thereby strengthening existing safeguards against unlawful voting; and

WHEREAS: maintaining accurate voter rolls is essential to ensuring fair elections and preserving public trust in election outcomes; and



3. Plans entitled "Barnegat Crossing III – Phase 2; Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan, Utility Plan for Block 92.112, Lots 42.05, 42.06 and 42.11", sheets 8 and 14 of 22; prepared by William Stevens, PE, dated 8/1/25, last revised March 31, 2026;
4. Cover letter dated April 8, 2026, prepared by Ian Borden PP, of Professional Design Services, LLC.

GENERAL COMMENTS

1. Applicant seeks Final Sanitary Sewerage System Facilities approval to permit the construction of a 3,694 sf stand alone fast food restaurant with drive thru on New Lot 42.06, and 16,480 sf Retail/Office building, with fast food restaurant, on New Lot 42.05. The submitted Utility Plan shows both new units being connected via gravity to public sewer via connections to existing sewer main in Lighthouse Drive (Ocean County).
2. Applicant received Preliminary Sanitary Sewer Facilities approval per Township Resolution 2026-70.
3. The applicant has calculated the following sewer flows:
 - a. Lot 42.05
 - i. Restaurant (fast food) 24 seats @ 15 gpd/seat = 360 GPD
 - ii. Retail/Office 15,000 SF@.100 gpd/sf = 1,500 GPD
 - b. Lot 42.06
 - i. Restaurant (fast food) 38 seats @ 15gpd/seat = 570 GPD
 - c. Total peak sewer flows = 2,430 gpd

4. Applicant proposes to connect to existing sanitary sewer service at Lighthouse Drive, an Ocean County roadway.
5. Fees: Per Chapter 74-7D(1)(b), **Final Sanitary Sewer Review Fees**:
 - a. 2% of estimated construction cost = $.02 \times \$31,260 = \625.20 (based upon Township Water and Sewer Engineer Estimate)

However, the Applicant's Sanitary Sewer construction cost estimate does not include the proposed grease trap on New Lot 42.06, and unit price for the service lateral used is nominal cost for residential, not the longer lengths proposed, nor the restoration of Lighthouse Drive. The Applicant has submitted \$650 for Final Sanitary Sewer Application fees, so these may be received and utilized for Final Review, and as condition of Final Approval, a revised application fee shall be required upon submittal of updated construction cost estimate by Applicants Engineer.

DESIGN COMMENTS

1. The Township of Barnegat and the Menk Corporation entered into a Sewer Extension Agreement on November 5, 1988 which provided that the Menk Corporation would contribute towards the construction of certain off-site sanitary sewer facilities within Barnegat Township. As part of this agreement, other developers within Barnegat Township that benefit from construction of the off-site sanitary sewer facilities are required to reimburse Menk Corporation via the Township for their pro-rata share of the cost of these improvements. Therefore, as a condition of any approval granted to the Applicant, they will be required to pay their pro-rata share of the cost of the off-site sanitary sewer facilities.
2. The Utility plan submitted for Preliminary approval indicated the proposed fast-food restaurant on New Lot 42.06 would connect to existing cleanout in front of property, at Lighthouse Drive. Now, the new Utility Plan, revised 3/31/26, indicates a new 4" lateral extending into Lighthouse Drive and connecting to the sewer main. Clarify reasons for revision. If the new utility service connection on new Sheet 8, last revised 3/31/26 is to remain, then a new cleanout shall be added at the curb of Lighthouse Drive. We note depth of sanitary sewer main at this connection point is approximately 14 feet.
3. It is noted that the sanitary lateral for New Lot 42.06 includes a proposed exterior grease trap, whereas the sanitary lateral for New Lot 42.05 does not show a proposed grease trap, and this Lot is also proposed to include a fast-food restaurant. Clarify grease trap provisions for New Lot 42.05, and revise plans accordingly.
4. Revise section 4.0 of the Sanitary Sewer Engineer's Report to update the construction cost estimate to include: grease trap, connection at Lighthouse Drive per updated Utility Plan, restoration of Lighthouse Drive, etc...
5. Confirm the proposed building on New Lot 42.05 is going to have only one sanitary lateral. Also, confirm the existing lateral in Lighthouse Drive has adequate capacity for sanitary sewer flow from New Lot 42.05.
6. Final sanitary sewer service building locations and sizing shall be dependent upon Final sewer system facilities submission, when final architectural plans are available to confirm location and sizing.
7. A final construction cost estimate shall be prepared by this office, pending receipt and review of Final Sanitary Sewerage Facilities application.

Applicant seeks Final Water System Facilities approval to permit the construction of a 3,694 sf stand alone fast food restaurant with drive thru on New Lot 42.06, and 16,480 sf Retail/Office building, with fast food restaurant, on New Lot 42.05. The submitted Utility Plan shows new Lot 42.05 being connected to public water via connection to existing water in Lighthouse Drive (Ocean County), whereas New Lot 42.06 is proposed to connect to existing water main in Kyle McGetrick Way. New Lot 42.05 connection includes 2" water service and 4" fire service, whereas New Lot 42.06 includes only new 2" service connection.
2. Applicant received Preliminary Water System Facilities approval per Township Resolution 2026-71.
3. The applicant has calculated the following water demands:
 - a. Lot 42.05
 - i. Restaurant (fast food) 24 seats @ 20gpd/seat = 480 GPD
 - ii. Retail/Office 15,000 SF@.125gpd/sf = 1,875 GPD
 - b. Lot 42.06
 - i. Restaurant (fast food) 38 seats @ 20gpd/seat = 760 GPD

- c. Total peak water demand = 3,115 gpd * 3.0 = 9,345 GPD = .009 MGD
4. Applicant proposes a “water meter vault” for New Lot 42.05, whereas New Lot 42.06 does not have method of water metering indicated.
 5. Fees: Per Chapter 74-17.2A(2), **Final Water Review Fees:**
 - a. 2% of estimated construction cost = .02 x \$48,125 = \$962.500 (based upon Township Water and Sewer Engineer Estimate)

However, the Applicant’s Water System construction cost estimate does not include the proposed method of water metering for either lot, nor the restoration of Lighthouse Drive and Kyle McGetrick Way. The Applicant has submitted \$650 for Final Water Application fees, so these may be received and utilized for Final Review, and as condition of Final Approval, a revised application fee shall be required upon submittal of updated construction cost estimate by Applicants Engineer

DESIGN COMMENTS

1. Various off-site water system improvements have been constructed by Mark Madison, LLC. In accordance with the developers’ agreement between Township of Barnegat and Mark Madison, LLC, all developers within the water system service area must reimburse Mark Madison LLC for their share of the cost of the improvements constructed and paid for by Mark Madison, LLC. Therefore, as a condition of any approval granted by the Township Committee, the Applicant must pay their share of the water system costs in the amounts and at the times set forth in the developers’ agreement.
2. Revise sheet 8 to identify each proposed gate valve size.
3. A proposed “Water Meter Vault” is called out for the 2” service line for new building on Lot 42.05, but should this be a 2” water meter pit, per detail sheet 14? Revise sheet 8 accordingly.
4. There is no proposed water meter pit for the new building on Lot 42.06. Revise sheet 8 to indicate water meter location for new building.
5. In the Water Engineer’s Report, revise Section 4.0, Construction Cost Estimate, to reflect water facility construction cost. Missing costs include proposed wet taps and valves, meter pits, fire service line for Lot 42.05, restoration of Lighthouse Drive and Kyle McGetrick Way, etc...
6. Verify proposed standalone fast food does not require separate fire service. If fire service is required, indicate on plans and updated engineers report and cost estimate.
7. Final plans shall indicate locations of proposed Fire Department Connections for both buildings, or comment if they are not required.
8. Revise detail sheet accordingly to clearly state which meter pit detail is for which lot. Is the 1-1/2” meter pit, typical for house connection, proposed?
9. Provide wet tap details according to each tapping main size and service main size.
10. Both lots water connections shall provide location of shut off valving, revise plans accordingly.
11. Final water service building locations and sizing shall be dependent upon Final water system facilities submission, when final architectural plans are available to confirm location and sizing, as well as mechanical room locations.
12. A final construction cost estimate shall be prepared by this office, pending receipt and review of Final Water System Facilities.
